"surely goodness and mercy will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever"

This scripture, this word from God, is an encouragement that is really all about life. A life so lived, that when we turn around and look back we don't see the past anymore, we see the goodness and mercy of God.
